SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. - The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources announced today that the state's archery and our archery and crossbow seasons crossbow seasons for white-tailed deer, black bear and wild boar will open on Sept. 30.

These popular seasons, which last through Dec. 31, coincide with the state's fall foliage season and give hunters a unique opportunity to enjoy West Virginia's scenic beauty. Hunters who want to get the most out of their hunting adventures are encouraged to purchase their license and stamps at WVhunt.com before the sea-

"In just a few weeks, the thrill of and the beauty of West Virginia's fall color will come together and give everyone a chance to connect with nature and enjoy incredible outdoor adventures." said WVD-NR Director Brett McMillion. "Whether you're an experienced hunter or just starting out, I encourage you to get your license and stamps early so you don't miss out on this season." White-Tailed Deer

Hunters may harvest one deer on their base license during the archery and crossbow season and may take up to two additional deer if they purchase a Class RB or RRB stamp before the season starts on Sept. 30. Depending on the county, one or two additional deer may be taken during the season. Resident landowners hunting on their own property and Class DT license holders are not required to purchase additional archery stamps.



In nine counties or portions thereof, hunters must take an antlerless deer in any regular deer season before harvesting a second antlered deer in that county. In West Virginia's four archery-only counties (Logan, McDowell, Mingo and Wyoming), hunters may not take more than two deer during the archery season and one deer must be antlerless.

Youth hunters, even if exempt from purchasing a license, are required to check their game on their own account. 

Catching Fall Bass

Fall bass fishing gives anglers of all skill levels the opportunity to catch dozenssometimes hundredsof bass in a single day. Unfortunately, many of us tend to make things a bit more complicated than they really need to be.

Pro Boyd Duckett makes a concerted effort to simplify his tackle selection throughout the autumn months. Instead of filling his boat with everything he owns, he focuses on 5 specific presentations that cover his bases in almost every stage of fall.

Crankbaits

Jerkbaits

Swimbaits

Topwaters

Lipless Crankbaits

Shallow and mid-depth crankbaits If the conditions line up well, you can certainly catch big fall bass by deep cranking creek ledges throughout the fall. A more consistent pattern, however, comes from utilizing shallow squarebills and mid-depth crankbaits.

Target shallow flats – "Most of the bass are going to be shallow this time of year," Duckett said. "I like to primarily target the 3 to 6-foot range and focus on shallow flats very close to creek channels. These flats are natural stopping


Water clarity matters – "If the water is stained, I suggest targeting the 1 to 3-foot range with the Yamamoto Chikara 100 Series, which is an incredible squarebill," Duckett said. 

Cover water quickly – "The key to fall fishing is putting the trolling motor on high and keep moving until you find something worth making multiple casts to," Duckett said. "The fish are going to be in groups, so it's important to move quickly until you find a school of active fish. The quicker you eliminate dead water, the faster you can get on a big sack of fish."

Magic water temperature – "You can catch hundreds of bass on these crankbaits throughout the fall, but your biggest fish will move shallow when the water temperature gets into the 50-degree range," Duckett said.

Keep changing it up - "I use shad patterns almost exclusively in the fall, but the bass can get very peculiar when they school," Duckett said. "If you're getting

color issue. More than likely, they want a different action. Make sure you keep switching between wide wobbling and flat-sided crankbaits for the best results because every school you find will be different."

Shallow jerkbaits

Jerkbaits are extremely overlooked lures for catching schooling bass in the fall. Schooling fish aren't difficult to locate this time of year, which means they get a lot of pressure from anglers. If you run across a wary school, a cy with your jerkbait color selecjerkbait is the way to go.


Force a reaction bite – "Jerkbaits are so effective right now because their aggressive, slashing action forces a bass to react,"

Stick with simple colors -



"There's no need to get too fantion," Duckett said. "On cloudy days or in lowlight conditions, I stick with a matte shad pattern to allow the fish to get a better bead on it. When it's sunny, you can't



Fishing with swimbaits is an excellent way to catch giant fall bass. While other reaction baits are used primarily for covering water, Duckett views a swimbait much like a cleanup hitter in a baseball lineup.

Important swimbait characteristics – "It's absolutely essential to find a swimbait that does two primary things," Duckett said. "You want the tail to produce a

The fish just annihilate that find schools, but when I find them I'll use a swimbait to catch the larger fish," Duckett said. "It's an excellent way to cull through schools in the fall. 1 and 2-pounders can be busting on top and you can catch big 4-pounders from underneath them with a swimbait. You won't get as many bites, but they'll be big."

> Head size is essential. – "Each swimbait has a specific cadence that gives it the most action," Duckett said. "In a sense, you're trapped at a certain reel speed, so 'reel slower' isn't the answer continue to page 14



"Walking topwater baits absolutely catch bigger fish in the fall and I think it's because they really trigger a bass' predatory instincts. That big bass thinks something is trying to get away and it can't help but attack it."

> Tired of short strikes on your topwater lures? In order to hook more bass, Duckett suggests reeling in your lure when it gets halfway back to the boat. Most of his short strikes come while his lure is close to the boat, so he reels it in quickly to avoid missing any opportunities at a big bass.

Crossbow Tips

1. Buy the best you can. There is of course a big difference between an inexpensive entry-level crossbow and a high-end crossbow. The bargaining model costs less, but it's not as well built, accurate and reliable as the more expensive model.

For example, you can buy a complete crossbow package that contains everything you need. For example, a crossbow, a few arrows and arrowheads, a telescopic sight, a jig, and a quiver for as little as \$100 to \$200. Adults who want to learn crossbow shooting can make do with a 120-pound throwing weapon. This quality device offers good precision and is easy to use.

3. Choose a higher pull weight this case faster.

The main difference between many crossbows is the draw weight. Better and more powerful crossbows usually start in the 175 lbs range, although one shouldn't generalize here either.

There are also excellent crossbows that are less than 150 lbs. In general, the bigger the better, or in this case faster.

Manufacturers of crossbows and compound bows are always trying to improve their flight characteristics. They make their crossbow faster to increase the weight of the draw.

However, the crossbow should be able to accelerate the arrow to an initial speed of at least 300 feet per second so that you can hit your target precisely over long distances of over 90m.

Many inexpensive crossbows have simple and basic sights or are auxiliary lines or points for scopes that make aiming difficult for long range shooting. You are much better served with a multiple crosshair or multi-red dot sight because these make aiming a lot easier. They are also available in many different magnifications.

Within aiming the device, there curve by holding it higher. aiming when you want to shoot over greater distances. You start with a single red dot or crosshair for simple aiming devices. You can aim very well with them for a fixed distance, usually 20 meters. For longer distances, you have to try to compensate for the ballistic

However, Multi-range crossbow scopes are the most popular because they show you multiple illuminated points, each suitable for a specific distance.

5. Use arrows/bolts as good as possible

Very cheap price arrows are usually not really well made, which is why they can break faster and also fly badly. So you should purchase arrows that have already received good ratings and are specially designed for crossbow shooting, as the crossbow bolts or arrows are shorter than bow arrows.

Arrows can be made of wood. aluminum, carbon or fiberglass, or a mixture of aluminum and carbon. Beginners are best to use aluminum arrows first, as these are cheap and robust.

If you want to invest a little more right away, you can get carbon arrows. Carbon arrow is the best seller among the crossbow arrows on the market. Because it is extremely light and flies surprisingly quickly.

6. Get the right accessories **Crossbow Essential Accessories**

A good purchase allows you to get several additional accessories such as bolts, spare parts, carrying case, and more. A rope tensioning aid is essential for every crossbow hunter. Of course, you can also cock the crossbow by hand, but after 10-20 cocking times, you run out of the air and your hands hurt.

Most of the tensioning aids are available for around \$20 and up.

7. Only shoot where allowed

Remember, a crossbow is a weapon. Always be aware of this phenomenon and constantly keep in mind that such a bolt flies at over 300 km / h and can kill someone with ease.

It is therefore best ALWAYS go to the nearest shooting range or shooting club to train. Appropriate safety measures have already been taken there and you can concentrate fully on the shooting.

If you don't have this option, you should shoot where there are no people. Large hills that are easily visible are always suitable. You can then place your target directly on the slope so that arrows that are not hit disappear into the ground and do not injure anyone. 8. Take care of your fingers

10. Practice makes perfect

The saying "practice makes perfect" also applies to crossbow hunting. Shoot from a surface (table, trestle, sandbag, bipod, etc.) on which the crossbow rests. Use these exercises to practice shooting with precision and to get a feel for the trigger. When you know your crossbow well, you will get better results.

However, certain fundamentals remain unchanged.

11. Take care of your crossbow regularly

The crossbow is a mechanical device that requires regular maintenance to keep it working as it did on the first day. This means that you should check all moving parts like the CAM system and the tendons for wear. This is very important because enormous forces act on the individual parts with every shot.

At the first sign of tendon fraying or other unusual signs of wear and tear, the parts should be replaced. With good care, of course, the repair effort is reduced, for example with the car.

After every workout, clean everything well and lubricate the tendons with wax so that they stay supple. The guide rail lubricates regularly with oil or special care

Always remember to relax the crossbow after a day of hunting. This can be accomplished by using equipment called a bandage or shooting a practice arrow at a target.

To prevent the string and the bow from breaking, it is imperative not to relax the bow manually by pulling the string dry without the arrow.

When archeologists discovered early evidence of our human ancestors' hunting activities, it became clear that adding meat to the diet meant big changes for early Homo sapiens. For example, skeleton size increased soon after. suggesting meat was important for evolution.

Dogs were most likely trained to hunt alongside humans in the early Neolithic era, and some breeds were developed to hunt specific animals.

Horses were raised to hunt starting in 2nd millennium.

In ancient Egypt, hunters were a separate class, often hunting for nobles and aristocrats as well as on their own.

The use of hunting dogs can be traced back to ancient Egypt, where greyhounds were used to track gazelles.

"Coursing" is the use of hounds in hunting.

"Gun dogs" are dogs that hunt by scent and sight, and both fetch birds after they have been killed as well as sighting them before. Setters, spaniels, and pointers are the most common "gun dog" breeds.

During the Middle Ages, hunting as a sport was reserved for the rich and done on private lands owned by aristocrats.

Some hunting techniques in the early modern era involved putting animals in an enclosed space and allowing them to be killed outright with little effort.

In many early Northern European tribes, slaves were forbidden from hunting since they were not allowed to own weapons or bear arms.

In 1515, the French government made hunting and poaching illegal for peasants.

Punishments for peasants who hunted on grounds owned by nobles included being sewn into a deerskin and chased by hunting dogs, who would kill the prey upon capture.

In the 1800s, over-hunting had brought about the extinction of several species, prompting the introduction of the extensive game laws currently in place in Great Britain.

In the UK, nothing more deadly than a double-barreled shotgun is allowed as a hunting weapon, as the shooter can only unload two bullets before reloading, thus allowing prey the chance to escape. It costs about \$20 and takes about 5 hours for the average deer hunter to secure one pound of venison. The most common "trophy" ani-

mal (an animal meant to be killed

Hunting Conservation Fact

Somewhat ironically, money spent on hunting helps fund wild-life conservation efforts

Taxes on hunting licenses and equipment pay for 60% of wildlife agencies' expenses. Less hunting means less funding, which is a concern for many state-run wildlife and recreational departments.

President Theodore Roosevelt, himself an avid hunter, helped create the "conservation through wise use" principle and encouraged other hunters to donate to causes that would preserve the land they hunted on New York sold its first deer hunting permit in 1864. President Roosevelt helped more states sell licenses, thus allowing for healthier revenue streams.[9]

In 1937, Congress passed legislation that required money earned from hunting licenses and products to be used for conservation efforts.

Almost a third of hunters in the United States are baby boomers. Most hunters retire from the sport by the age of 65.




