



## **2024 Black Bear Harvest Results**

— The West Virginia Division sons (Sept. 28 – Nov. 24), hunters of Natural Resources (WVDNR) announced today that hunters in West Virginia harvested 2,479 black bears during the combined 2024 archery, crossbow and firearms seasons.

The preliminary harvest for the combined 2024 seasons was lower than the 2,830 bears taken in 2023. As predicted by the 2024 Mast Survey and Hunting Outlook, the archery/crossbow harvest remained consistent with the previous year. However, the overall bear firearms harvest was lower than in 2023, despite a higher harvest during the September and October season segments.

During the first segment of the in Kanawha County.

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. 2024 archery and crossbow sea- for archery/crossbow harvests harvested 899 bears. Of these harvests, 431 were taken with vertical bows and 468 were taken with crossbows. The top five counties

were Fayette and Preston (55 each), Webster (48), Boone (43), Nicholas (42) and Wyoming (40).

During the firearms season, hunters harvested 1,580 bears. This included 611 bears taken during the September and October seasons, 166 bears during the September youth, Class Q, XS season, 20 bears during the October youth, Class Q, XS season, 57 bears during the concurrent antlerless deer/bear season and 368 during the three early firearms seasons.

Additionally, hunters harvested 271 bears during the concurrent buck-gun bear season and 697 bears during the traditional December season. One bear was harvested with a muzzleloader during the Mountaineer Heritage Season. The top five counties for firearms harvests were Nicholas (167), Boone (153), Kanawha (115), Fayette (109), and Logan (92). 
> What!!! You might think, how is that even possible? I believe that

For the Musky, it's on the same principle. The lure has to look right, It has to smell right, and it has to act right. The fish, like you, gets so involved, he forgets he has been caught 10 times before. And he takes it-HOOK, LINE, AND SINKER.

If you can do that, then you are die. truly a World Class Musky Fisherman.

Here let me prove it to you. Pay close attention to what I'm about to tell you.

One day, my two grandsons and I were out on the lake and we caught a beautiful 47 inch Musky at the Stonewall Jackson lake and released it. We went back to fishing, and after about 30 minutes or so, we noticed him swimming on top of the water. Swim as he may, he just stayed on top. It appeared, thing. 



ly an endangered species, there were two points in the past when we almost lost them completely. According to the Colorado Arts and Sciences Magazine, the California turkey went extinct about 10,000 to 12,000 years ago, likely due to climate change or overhunting, or a combination of the two. And when European settlers arrived in America, turkeys again found themselves as targets of prolific hunting. The birds were totally gone from Connecticut by 1813, disappeared from Vermont around 1842, and by the 1930s, turkeys were again growing dangerously close to extinction before efforts were taken to make sure they weren't wiped out.



15 Store-bought turkeys can't fly.

The turkey that you buy at the grocery store has been bred and raised to provide you with as much meat as possible. Because of this, they end up with unnaturally large breasts which hinder their ability to fly, according to The Patriot News.

16 Wild turkeys, however, can soar for over a mile.

Wild turkeys, on the other hand, are perfectly capable of taking flight. In fact, according to The Patriot News, they can reach speeds of up to 55 miles per hour while in the air. And the Pennsylvania Game Commission reports they can soar for a mile or more by alternating between strong wingbeats and gliding.

17 Turkeys can run 12 miles per hour.

REVIEW WEST VIRGINIA'S TURKEY HUNTING REGULA-TIONS

Even if you've been hunting for years, we recommend familiarizing yourself with the regulations before you go into the field. Here's what you need to know:

It is illegal to use an electronic call, bait turkeys, hunt with dogs and kill a turkey without a beard during the spring season.

It is illegal to hunt with an air rifle less than .22 caliber or have an uncased bow, crossbow or firearms in your possession in the woods outside shooting hours (30 minutes before sunrise to 1 p.m.). Adult hunters may harvest one bearded bird per day, and the season bag limit is two.


During the special two-day youth season, youth hunters under the age of 18 may harvest one bearded bird per day, which counts towards the annual turkey bag limit of two. Only shotguns, bows, or crossbows are legal implements of hunting during the youth Spring Gobbler Season. BUY YOUR WEST VIRGIN-IA HUNTING LICENSE AND **STAMPS** 

All hunters 15 and older are required to have a valid West Virginia hunting license, which can be purchased at approximately 160 retail agents around the state or online at WVhunt.com. When it comes to hunting turkey, you may also need to purchase stamps. Resident landowners or their resident children or their resident parents or resident tenants of such land, may hunt on their own land without a license during the open seasons.

West Virginia residents who have a lifetime license or purchase one of our sportsman licenses, are all set. If you buy a regular hunting and trapping license (Class A), you'll also need to purchase a conservation (Class CS) and big game hunting stamp (Class BG). Nonresidents who purchase a regular hunting and trapping license (Class E) will need to buy a conservation and law enforcement

stamp (Class CS/LE) and a turkey hunting stamp (Class WW).

HUNTING GEAR

Having the right gear is critical for a successful spring gobbler

season. The most common firearm used for turkey hunting is a 12- or 20-gauge pump action or semi-automatic shotgun. Your shotgun may have additional features, but you'll want to inspect it to make sure it can be safely discharged in the field.

Safety and functionality are key, so take the time to inspect each piece of gear thoroughly. Make sure your camouflage will help continue to page 29

you blend in with your surroundings and that your clothes will keep you warm. Double-check your hunting knife is sharp and test your turkey calls, range finder and binoculars to make sure they're in working order. Sturdy boots should provide both comfort and protection for navigating uneven terrain, and a well-organized hunting vest or backpack can make the difference between a smooth hunt and a frustrating one.

#### CHECK YOUR GAME

Before the spring gobbler season starts, make sure you are prepared to field dress and electronically check your turkey. Login to your WVDNR account and print plenty of field tags and gather a sharp knife, gloves and a clean bag or tarp to lay the turkey on. Practice your technique, if needed, and make sure your equipment is sanitized to avoid contamination.

Once you've harvested a turkey, fill out a field tag immediately, including your name, address, license number (if applicable), date, time and location of the harvest. Attach this tag to the turkey before moving it. Then, electron-

## **Spring Trout Fishing Information**

Spring is a season of change, it is which really causes the tempera- wait in the deepest, slowest flowgenerally represented by thawing ice and spawning fish. In the very early springs, rivers and streams often flow low and clear, and much of the water is still frozen. As the ice and snowmelt, water levels rise and shallow, gin clear streams become torrents.

If I were to offer one key piece of advice to catch more trout when fishing during the spring is to seek and fish the warmest water you can find. That is because trout are very temperature sensitive, and if the water is too cold, they become sluggish and reluctant to feed.

1) Hints on where to fish in the early spring

First, I want to discuss where to fish. Trout fishing when the water is very cold is tough. So it is important to try and find slightly warmer water.

The warmest water, and generally the best place to target trout in the spring, is generally found in spring fed streams, deep lakes and reservoirs, and the tailwaters downstream of them.

Unless you live in a particularly mild climate, I suggest avoiding freestone and snowmelt rivers. Such rivers often contain a large volume of snow and ice melt

ture to drop.

2) In rivers, and streams target deeper, slower flowing water.

In the spring, trout are very reluctant to move, and still want to conserve their energy. This means they'll sit and wait, rather than actively cruise in search of food.

As a result, trout are likely to

ing parts of a river, where there is just enough current to bring the food to them. This does differ from the warmer months where they are more likely to feed right on the edge of the current.

When not feeding, trout will rest on the bottom of the deepest slowest water. The same often holds true year, round and not just in the spring.

In the spring, when the water is still cold, trout are most likely to feed in the deepest, slowest flowing sections of a run.

3) In Lakes and Ponds target Shallows and Drop Offs

Just like in the winter, shallow flats remain a great place to target trout in lakes. That is because shallow water warms slightly faster than depths so, during the continue to page 32



day, lake-dwelling trout leave the deeper water where they spend the night to cruise the shallows in search of food.

Another prime spot to target trout in lakes is around the edge of drop offs. If fishing from a boat, it is a good idea to use the fish finder to locate drops offs down to about 15 yards. Trout often patrol such areas in search of food.

4) River mouths in empty into lakes and larger rivers are a hot spot for spring fishing.

The final, and maybe the hottest spot to target in the early spring is at river mouths. That is because fish gather there to spawn. It is not only rainbow trout that spawn in the early spring month but several species of baitfish. So shoals of baitfish gather around river mouths before pushing upstream. Large, hungry trout know that so



are often laying in wait.

5) Use a thermometer to find streams warmer than 45f

I often carry a thermometer with me while trout fishing. Trout, like all fish are cold blooded. When the water is cold they slow down, and they become more active when it warms slightly. In very warm conditions they start to suffocate.

Trout prefer to feed in temperatures between 45-65 degrees, and while trout can still be caught in water colder than that they become increasingly challenging.

So whenever I head out fishing, I record the water temperature, and over time I start to learn which rivers and ponds warm faster, and which remain cold well into the spring. This allows me to concentrate my fishing efforts on the warmest waters.

Flowers on Pussy Willows are an early sign of spring, despite the water still being icy cold and the trout were in no mood to feed. 6) Fish the warmest part of the day

So much fishing advice says the best time to trout fishing is the dawn. Well, this only applies in warm water conditions.

In the spring, trout waters are still chilly, and trout often do not become active until the sun is higher in the sky and the temperature has started to rise slightly. So when trout fishing, target the warmest part of the day. This is usually some time between 10am and 4pm.

7) Spring trout are sluggish, use slow presentations.

In the early spring, trout are still sluggish. They do not want to waste energy on a high speed chase. So a very slow presentation works best, give the trout as much time as possible to strike. 8) Spring trout are more likely to

stay deep

Trout rarely feed from the surface or rise during the spring. Several reasons why, but one of the main one is the lack of hatches and terrestrial insects. So unless you see trout actively rising, it is nearly always better to fish sub surface.

If you do see an early spring rise, then the trout are probably feeding upon midges rather than mayflies.

9) Avoid spawning Rainbow and Cutthroat trout

Spring is when these two species of trout spawn. While it is generally okay to target them during the spawning run, it is best to avoid fishing for them entirely while they are on their redds. Both species of trout generally make their redds in shallow grav- Kyke Stackpole landed a huge el fairly close to shore. Often in flathead catfish last fall.

the perfect depth for wading. At this time of year, only observe spawning trout and do not try to catch them. This helps protect the next generation of trout. I also try to avoid wading up wading streams, because that can disturb





Once the trout have finished spawning, it is okay to target them. Just keep in mind that they are usually in poor condition so need to be handled with care when catch and release fishing. 10) Use thin line and leaders

In the early spring, the water can be very low and clear. In such crystal clear conditions, it is very important to use a low diameter line to avoid spooking trout. In such conditions, I nearly always fish 4lb line.

11) Keep track of recent stockings

Starting in the spring many fisheries departments start to stock lakes and rivers with new releases of trout. If all you care about is catching fish, then heading to the ponds with recent releases usually gives the best chance of success.

These newly released stock trout are often more willing to feed than wild or holdover trout.

12) Start of the melt can be amazing fishing

Melting snow and ice usually chill the water, but there is one exception. The first few days of the

spring melt can cause the trout to feed hard. The surge of meltwater can cause water levels to rise rapidly. This rapid thaw can wash the bodies of many insects into the river.

This readily available source of food can cause the trout to gorge themselves. So as long as the water does not get too cold, there can be a few days of amazing fishing as the thaw begins.


