Record Black Bear Harvest

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.VA. — West Virginia hunters harvested a record 3,541 black bears during the 2020 archery and firearms seasons, according to preliminary numbers gathered by the state Division of Natural Resources.

The 2020 harvest is more than the previous record of 3,201 black bears taken during the 2015 seasons and a 14 percent increase over the 3,099 bears taken in 2019. West Virginia hunters have taken more than 3,000 black bears in five out of the last six years.

Hunters killed 1,095 bears during the first segment of the 2020 archery/crossbow season (Sept. 26 to Nov. 22). Hunters harvested 569 bears with vertical bows and 526 bears with crossbows. The top five counties were Fayette (76), Nicholas (59), Raleigh (55), Preston (55)

and Boone (53).

"We saw increased harvest numbers during the September/October and bow/crossbow seasons and then numbers decreased slightly during the buck-gun and December seasons," said Colin Carpenter, black bear project leader for the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources.

Firearms hunters harvested 2,442 bears in 2020. Hunters took 1,225 bears in September and October (including 38 bears during the concurrent antlerless deer/bear season and 19 during the youth, class Q/ QQ, XS season), 470 during the concurrent buck-gun bear season and 747 bears during the traditioncontinue to the next page

al December season. Four bears were harvested during the third Mountaineer Heritage Season (two by bow, two by muzzleloader). The top five counties were Nicholas (190), Randolph (185), Webster (168), Pocahontas (152) and Greenbrier (148).

Decreased Mast Production Affected 2020 Black Bear Harvest Carpenter said hard and soft mast production in 2020 was down 39 percent compared to 2019 and 35 percent below the long-term average, which affects harvest numbers over the course of the black bear hunting seasons.

"Scarce mast yields an increased bow/crossbow harvest and a decreased December firearms har-

vest," he said. "So, providing ample early season hunting opportunities before bears have entered the den helps to decrease large fluctuations in the total bear harvest."

While mast production was down in 2020, Carpenter said a few species produced more than the longterm average. Red oak and black oak was up 27 percent and scarlet oak was up 56 percent. Unfortunately, mast production by red/ black oak and scarlet oak could not offset the declines in the other species surveyed. Beech was down 51 percent, hickory decreased 54 percent, white oak dropped 12 percent and chestnut oak was down 17 percent.

The 2020 Mast Survey and Hunting Outlook predicted that 2020 would have a similar bow/crossbow harvest compared to 2019 and an increased firearms harvest over the levels observed in 2019. However, the bow/crossbow, firearms and the overall harvest were much higher than 2019.

French Creek Freddy

FRENCH CREEK, W.VA. — French Creek Freddie, West Virginia's famous weather-prognosticating groundhog, has predicted an early spring for the Mountain State.

Freddie made his prediction Tuesday morning during a private ceremony in his home at the WV State Wildlife Center. This year's Groundhog Day Celebration was cancelled due to COVID-19.

"Freddie wishes he could have celebrated his special day with all his friends this year, but he's in high spirits and hopes an early spring will encourage folks to visit him at the Wildlife Center soon," said Trevor Moore, WVDNR wildlife biologist.

According to tradition, an early spring can be expected if Freddie doesn't see his shadow, which is a result of an overcast sky on Groundhog Day. After more than 40 years of making Groundhog Day predictions, Freddie is correct about 50 percent of the time. This is the second year in a row he has called for an early spring.

"Freddie might be predicting an early spring, but don't put your coats and mittens away just yet because there's still plenty of time to get out and enjoy beautiful winter scenery here in West Virginia,"



said Zack Brown, WVDNR assistant chief of operations.

The West Virginia Wildlife Center is home to French Creek Freddie and nearly 30 different native and introduced animal species. The 338-acre facility remains open to visitors with extra precautions for preventing the spread of COVID-19. Hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., seven days a week through the end of March. Admis-

Firearm Buck Harvest For 2021

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.VA. — Hunters in West Virginia harvested 38,776 antlered deer during the two-week buck firearms season, according to preliminary data collected through the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources'





The 2020 buck harvest was 6 percent higher than the harvest in 2019, when hunters took 36,796 bucks. The top 10 counties by harvest are Preston (1,469), Randolph (1,428), Hampshire (1,380), Greenbrier (1,317), Pendleton (1,296), Hardy (1,169), Braxton (1,089), Grant (1,088), Pocahontas (1,082), and Jackson (1,063).

"It's been a good year for deer hunting in West Virginia and these preliminary numbers for the buck season harvest are really encouraging," said Gary Foster, assistant chief of game management for the WVDNR.

Buck harvests in West Virginia's north central region, eastern panhandle and in southwestern counties saw increases of 9 percent, 17 percent and 43 percent, respectively. Excellent harvests in these regions offset declines in the state's central mountain region and western and southeastern counties, where the harvest decreased by 2 percent, 5 percent and 7 percent, respectively.

Interesting Hunting Facts

1. African Hunting Dogs vote to decide whether to go on a hunt or not. The most important animals in the pack need only garner around 3 votes; the lesser dogs need about 10.

2. Grizzly bears were so feared and respected by Native Americans that hunting them required a company of 4 to 10 warriors and was done with the same preparation and ceremonial as intertribal warfare.

3. In 2014, Namibia raised over \$350k by auctioning off the right to hunt one endangered black rhino. The rhino was past breeding age and detrimental to the rest of the herd. The money was used to protect endangered animals.

4. In 1859, English settler Thomas Austin released only 24 rabbits onto his property in Australia, stating "The introduction of a few rabbits could do little harm and might provide a touch of home, in addition to a spot of hunting." By the 1920's the population reached 10 billion.

5. If you don't pay child support in Texas you won't be able to renew your hunting license.


the world's last passenger pigeon, died alone in 1914 at the Cincinnati Zoo, USA.



17. The Nazi's were staunch animal rights activists with major efforts to limit hunting and general animal cruelty. Göring, in particular, was a professed animal lover who proclaimed bans on both vivisection(Nazi Germany was the first country in the world to do so) and the shoeing of horses. 18. Edward James Jim Corbett tracked and well-documented killed 33 man-eaters, 19 tigers, and 14 leopards, that combined to kill over 1,200 people. Despite the dangerous nature of the beasts he was hunting, Corbett traveled alone and by foot while hunting the cats.

19. The Burkitshi are nomadic hunters of Mongolia. They capture a golden eagle at the age of four and train it to become a hunting partner. The Burkitshi live and sleep with the eagle for ten years, and then it is released back into the wilderness before death. – 20. 
Preseason Turkey Hunting Tips

Most of us have done it: We wake up and head into the turkey woods before daylight, not knowing where, when, or even if there is a turkey within 10 miles, much less a turkey within an acceptable range to make a move. And, yes, sometimes you can make it work. But if you want to better your odds, a few extra preseason hours spent in the woods can make a huge difference. 1. The only real way to get your mind wrapped around what a turkey is doing throughout the day is to spend time watching them. A great set of binoculars is key to scouting pre-season birds. I use an Athlon Optics 8x40 Ares. The 8x magnification is perfect for glassing birds at a distance and as with any high-quality glass, it is less likely to fog up in the warm spring weather. Watch them move in and out of food sources and pay attention to traveling routes. This makes setting-up ground blinds on midday strut zones and feeding areas much easier and also helps in determining how to set decoys within food sources to maximize visibility to approaching turkeys. Good, clear, high-quality optics help me identify individual birds that I may want to focus on.



2. Once I've located birds and potential ambush spots in core areas I place ground blinds, making sure to brush them in well and good. I use a layering system. I use big limbs right against the blind and, working my way out, use smaller grasses and cedar twigs to break up the outline and give added depth. Also keep in mind the direction of the sun in relation to where you will be looking. Nothing is worse than sitting in a ground blind and staring into the sun for hours on end.

3. After I have identified core areas and have a few mid-day blinds set up, I like to focus in on roosting areas. Most of the time turkeys will roost in the same general areaas long as a coyote or a lonesome hen doesn't change their pattern, of course. And, yes, spring birds do have a pattern—to an extent. They use the same fields, roosting areas and travel routes on a day-to-day basis. That being said, no matter how much homework you've done, a hen is a game changer in any scenario. A hot hen can take a habitual tom and lead him away on a leash.

woods and you'll soon realize that vocalization is key to success when chasing spring gobblers. Practicing with your calls is one of the most crucial things we can do as turkey hunters. I spend weeks prior to every season with a diaphragm call in my mouth clucking, purring and yelping till I feel like I am right on pitch with that old boss hen I am trying to imitate. It helps to make sure that I can produce the calls and sounds I need to convince that old long beard that I'm in the mood for love.

5. Conditioning box calls and pot calls is a necessity and makes a huge difference in the quality and consistency of the sounds your call produces. I keep a good supply of box-call chalk and sand paper on hand before and during the season. For me, it's a night-before-the-hunt tradition to get all my calls out and get everything in pristine condition for the next day. It gets me in the right mindset and also helps me get out all the call-jitters so I feel comfortable calling when the real time comes.

6. Last but not least: Make sure your firearm is in working order. You'd be surprised at how many times turkey hunters have hit the woods only to experience the dreaded "click" of a busted gun. Let's be honest: Nothing else matters if you can't close the deal. A working gun is first and foremost, but to further ensure a successful, ethical harvest, it pays to pattern your shotgun and make sure your using a good combination of gun, choke and shells to get the maximum lethality from your thunderstick. I like to pattern my gun at 30 yards. But I recommend also checking it at 40, 50 and even 60 yards to see what your maximum effective range is. This can be a not-so-pleasant experience with the punishing blow of a $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch turkey load. I advise any hunter to pattern their shotgun from a rest or a gun sled. This reduces recoil and in turn provides a more accurate assessment of the pattern.

In the end we can do everything right and still not bring home a bird. However, I have learned that if you spend the time in the woods and do your homework it not only increases your chance of success, but makes for a much more rewarding hunt. Anyone can get lucky and happen across a bird now and then. Knowing you did your part, knowing the skill involved in taking that trophy tom—that's what bragging rights are all about.

Alabama Bass May End Up In WV

An angler in Virginia had been fishing at Claytor Lake in Virginia and caught what he thought was a state record spotted bass. After DNA examination, it turns out it was an Alabama bass which is a cousin to the spotted bass.

Why is that a concern for West Virginia anglers? Stripers are known to leave Claytor Lake and travel to Bluestone Lake. The stripers are often leave Bluestone Lake and are sometimes caught clear up to Sandstone Falls. It's quite possible that eventually, Alabama bass may end up in the New River and later the Kanawha River. Eventually, the Ohio River is next. Worse yet, the


Alabama bass can cross breed with smallmouth bass. The impact on the smallmouth population in the New River will be dramatic.

Spotted bass are often disregarded by anglers as a smaller sort of bass, and by some fishery managers as a small, aggressive species that can become overabundant and reduce populations of other bass species. But those who have caught "spots" appreciate their whip-cracking strikes and tough fights.

in some southeastern reservoirs and recent catches of 10- and 11-pound specimens in California. What's up with spotted bass?

History

In 1802, the fisheries world recognized two species of black bass: largemouth bass, Micropterus salmoides, and smallmouth bass, Micropterus dolomieu, first described by French naturalist Bernard Germain de Lacépède. The spotted bass was proposed as a separate species, Micropterus punctulatus, in 1819, but not officially recognized until 1940. Any angler who's tangled with spots might wonder what took so long to recognize such a different fish as a different species. But as we know, there are rules for the scientific community to recognize new species, and the process moves slowly.

Biologists puzzled for decades why some spotted bass populations offered anglers large fish (over 3 pounds) while spotted bass over 15 inches and 1.5 pounds were rare in others. Subspecies of spotted bass—northern spotted bass, also called Kentucky spotted bass, and Alabama spotted bass—have long

been recognized. The Alabama bass, Micropterus henshalli, was recognized as a separate species in 2008 after scientists found that it wasn't closely related to the northern spotted bass, but genetically most similar to the redeye bass.

Yet for many anglers and a few biologists, the Alabama bass is still a spotted bass. But recognizing the separate identity of these two "spotted bass" species is important for several reasons, including effective management, angler expectations, and establishing catch records. For clarity, I use the names of these fish now recognized by the American Fisheries Society—Alabama bass and spotted bass. Biology

Spotted bass are native to the southeastern U.S. from the Appalachians west to eastern Kansas, Oklahoma, and Texas. The species has been introduced peripheral to its native range and as far west as California. While studies have documented subtle habitat preferences, spotted bass can thrive in most waters that contain largemouth or smallmouth bass. They reach sexual maturity at 11 to 12 inches and spawning occurs when water temperatures are 60°F to 72°F. Shallow nests are excavated on firm bottom in shallow water, although spotted bass are known to spawn deeper than other black bass.

Spotted bass are opportunistic predators, with adults consuming primarily fish and crayfish. Although varying throughout their range, spotted bass usually grow to 12 inches in about three years and 16 to 18 inches by age-7. Maximum size rarely exceeds 3 pounds, but state records over 6 pounds have been caught from waters not known to have Alabama bass (Arkansas: 7 pounds 15 ounces; Mis-



souri 7 pounds 8 ounces; Tennessee: 6 pounds 11 ounces).

The Alabama bass is native to the Mobile River basin (Alabama, Black Warrior, Cahaba, Coosa, Tallapoosa, and Tombigbee rivers) in Alabama, eastern Mississippi, and northwestern Georgia. The species continue to the next page

has been introduced to California, Texas, and east of its restricted range. Limited habitat studies suggest Alabama bass orient to slow currents in rivers, and deeper water and rock and gravel habitats in reservoirs. They seem to thrive when faced with fluctuating water levels. Spawning isn't well described but seems similar to spotted bass. Diet of adults is fish and crayfish.

Alabama bass grow to 12 inches by age-3 and to 23 inches by age-8 in central Alabama reservoirs. The Alabama state record is 8 pounds 15 ounces, and the California and world-record fish is 11 pounds 4 ounces.

Identification

Genetic analysis is the only way to be sure a specimen is an Alabama bass or a spotted bass, but external characteristics can be used to distinguish Alabama bass and spotted bass. The most reliable way to separate the species is to count the "pored scales" (scales with holes) in the lateral line. Although tedious, this can be done with a low-power magnifying glass. Alabama bass usually have 71 or more pored scales, spotted bass 70 or fewer.

Walleye Fishing Sees Improvement In WV

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.VA. — Anglers in West Virginia who want a good chance at catching a trophy walleye have the next two months to enjoy some of the best fishing in the state.

"There's never a bad time to go fishing when you're in West Virginia, but if you want to target walleye, especially in rivers, you need to go in colder months, between November and March," said Mark Scott, assistant chief of fish management for the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources.

West Virginia's native walleye grow quickly and reach trophy

sizes, which makes them a popular sport fish for anglers. These unique, large-eyed predators also have been part of a special management project to improve and diversify fishing opportunities in the Mountain State since the early 2000s.

"It's encouraging to see all our efforts paying off," Scott said. continue to page 27

Scott said outfitters around the state have told him that people as far as Canada are visiting the state to go walleye fishing.

"It's cool to hear that because it means we've developed a fishery that's known worldwide," he said. Catching Walleye

Walleye usually feed early in the morning and late in the evening or on overcast days. Scott says anglers should target walleye during these low-light periods when fish are most active.

"Anything that blocks upstream movement such as locks and dams or waterfalls are good places to target walleye," Scott said. "For our native walleye, anglers will want to fish the rivers upstream of the Winfield Lock and Dam such as the Elk River, Coal River, upper Kanawha River and New River."

This time of year, walleye are moving upstream to areas such as Kanawha Falls, Sandstone Falls and the falls on the Coal River to prepare for spawning. When they can't swim further upstream, they congregate in preparation for the

spawning season in March.

"There are a lot of walleye in these areas right now," Scott said. "Now's a perfect time to go out and enjoy a fishing trip but anglers need to familiarize themselves with the regulations for the rivers they will be fishing. Some areas such as Sandstone Falls are under no-harvest regulations or other special regulations."

To enjoy the thrill of catching a walleye, anglers need to purchase a 2021 West Virginia Fishing license, available at license agents and WVDNR district offices around the state and online at wvfish.com.

Winter Bass Fishing

I live in east Tennessee where I'm blessed to be able to fish 12 months a year. The smallmouth fishing can be really good here in wintertime on our highland lakes like Cherokee and Norris.

The smallmouth is the most active species in winter, but things have changed a lot over the past 10 years or so. When I fished for wintertime smallies as a teenager, they would be feeding on crawfish and threadfin shad in 5 to 20 feet of water. One way to pick them off was by casting to rock transitions on the bank. It wasn't that complicated.

You only needed three or four lures back then. Day in and day out a finesse jig was the most consistent bait. Jerkbaits and crankbaits that mimicked threadfin shad would catch them, too.

Those tactics still work, but not as consistently as they used to. When I fish transition banks these days I throw a 3/8-ounce finesse jig dressed with a 4-inch Yamamoto Double Tail Grub, a Duel Hardcore Minnow Flat SP jerkbait and a Duel Hardcore Shad crankbait.

Somehow, alewives were introduced into these lakes several years

By Brandon Card ago. They have overtaken threadfin shad as the primary bass forage and have completely changed the way we fish for the smallmouth. It's kind of like what happened when blueback herring got into lakes in the Carolinas. Wintertime smallmouth now tend to stay much deeper and move with the alewives.

Instead of reading rock transitions on the bank like I used to do, I have to spend a lot of time idling around offshore looking for schools of alewives 20- to 50-feet deep with my Lowrance units. I typically find the bass relating to alewives on flats and gentle tapering points. Alewives, especially on Cherokee, like to hang in depressions on the bottom. These places look like old



ponds or sinkholes on Navionics lake charts.

One of my most productive presentations is casting a little 4-inch Yamamoto Single Tail Grub on a 1/2-ounce finesse football jighead. I throw it out there, let it go to the bottom and slow roll it right over the rocks. Natural Shad and Baby Bass are two really good colors for this.

Another effective deal is to vertically fish a jighead dressed with a soft plastic minnow bait. Some people call this the freestyle jig technique. Others call it the Damiki rig. The jig should have a very realistic looking minnow head. I put a Yamamoto Shad Shape Worm on a 3/8-ounce jig and drop it down through the alewives and hover it over the smallmouth I see on my Lowrance units.

It can be a frustrating way to catch them because you'll see a bass come up to the bait, go back down, come up again and sometimes refuse the jig again. They're picky because they have so many alewives to munch on.

If you can keep your jig in the right zone long enough, a bass will

finally commit to it. When you catch one, the school fires up and you can catch three to five bass in a row. It's a great technique for a team tournament because when one angler hooks up, there's a really high chance that the partner will hook up immediately.

In the old days of tournament bass fishing, those individuals who always did well were fishermen who everyone knew, and they were referred to as the "ringers". We all know you I'm talking about whether it was on the Ohio river, or the mighty Mon, and all the states lakes. Certain names always seem to show up at the end of the day, and to nobodies surprise, these angular always seemed to find fish when others didn't, and cash a check. How did they consistently find, and catch fish when others didn't?

This article is meant to demonstrate to the next generation of bass anglers some of the key aspects of being competitive in bass fishing in our state, or anywhere in the country. It is my hope that maybe the

I've seen countless people in this sport show up on tournament day, launch their boat, and come in at the end of the day discouraged because they didn't catch the size, and quantity of fish they needed to place, or

yourself into a position to win, you more than like finished in the top 10% of the field. This is how I always gauged how well I was keyed into the tournament and the fishing on that particular day. At the end of the day, if I had put myself in a position to win, then that was a success!

Is there a learning curve associated with bass fishing, absolutely! Is this curve as steep, and difficult to master as it used to be, definitely not! In the not too distant past, the only way to become an angular that was a threat to win was to spend hours and hours of practice on a given body of water. You also had to develop solid techniques with baits that you were confident with. I know one very successful angular who likes to use a Zoom brush hog 90% of the time when he is fishing plastics. I asked him one time if he ever used anything else, and

he replied "why"? I took that to mean that he had 100% confidence in this bait, and his success in tournaments says that he is right! So the moral oof this point is you do not have to have hundreds of baits in all the colors made. I know of another highly successful angular who loves to fish the Yamato Sen-



with his choice of soft plastic as the brush hog angular, and I'd never bet against him when the fish are focused upon a finicky bite! It's all about becoming knowledgable of what the fish want, and how they want it. Lastly, I know of another fisherman who hardly ever pitches plastics because he has learned how to get bites on a jig. He fishes a jig as his primary go to bait, and can send it zipping out of his bait caster mere inches above the water, and drop it behind a log with nary a splash. It's uncanny how many places he can get his jig into, and usually his "jig fish" tend to be larger bass. I cornered him after an event where he had 5 fish for 15.05 pounds, all on a jig, and asked him why he liked to fish a jig. He said because it catches bigger fish! I thought that was a pretty solid answer! He went on to say that jig fishing to him was the best way to catch quality fish, and a jig can be made to imitate a crawfish, bluegill or anything that swims that an ole bass might just want to snack on. Based upon his track record, I tend

Later on in your fishing you will adopt new techniques, and maybe develop you own way of catching bass! Until then, stick with the basics, spend time on the water, join a club and enjoy this sport we call bass fishing.




